Summons.

IN THE SECOND JUDICIAL DISTRICT Court of the State of Nevada, in and for the County of Humboldt.—Lizzie Oliver, plaintiff, vs. Henry Oliver, defendant. Action brought in the second Judicial District Court of the State of Nevada, in and for the County of Humboldt, and the complaint filed in the office of the Clerk of said District Court on the 19th day of Oct. A. D. 1895.

The State of Nevada sends greeting to Henry Oliver, defendant. You are hereby required to appear in an action brought against you by the above named plain if. Lizzie Oliver, in the District Court of the State of Nevada, in and for the County of Humboldt, and to answer the complaint filed therein with the Clerk of said Court within ten days (exclusive of the day of service) after the service on you of this Summons, if served within this County; or, if served out of this County but in this Judicial District, within twenty days; otherwise, within forty days; or judgment by default will be taken against you, according to the prayer of said complaint.

Said action is brought to obtain a decree dissolving the bonds of matrimony now existing between herself and you, on the grounds of extreme cruelty; and for the custody of the minor child, Mabel Oliver, she being the daughter of plaintiff and defendant herein.

All of which will more fully appear by reference to said complaint, a certified copy of which accompanies this Summons, and is made a copy hereof.
